LONG RANGE PLANNING - Presented by Tr. Dick Lombard

A representative of Allied Aquatics gave a presentation on the cost and benefits of a herbicide treatment approach. A sub-committee was appointed to gather data on the current repairing, costs of operating and maintaining the weed harvester. The committee will review various options to include, but not limited to, harvesting, herbicide treatment, biological and dredging. sufficient data has been collected this information, along with any recommendations, will be forwarded to the Lake/Dam Committee.

A report on proposed construction of additional golf cart sheds was presented by Carl Nielsen and Wally Barker. The committee found

Chairman Stricklin presented the proposed Green House regulation. A discussion on the necessity of a reinspection of a green house structure every eighteen (18) months followed. Tr. Feist expressed that he did not think it appropriate to have a reinspection charge.

Motion was made by Tr. Wilson-Hoss, seconded by Tr. Lombard and carried by the Board as follows with Tr. Getty opposing:

That the Green House Regulation be approved without a reinspection charge.

Chairman Stricklin reported that several members attended the committee meeting and expressed their concern relative to the modular home on Lot 111 of Division Two. They were informed that the application for this home was approved via interpretation of the rules previously approved by the Board of Trustees.

Member Chuck Stewart addressed a concern of lots being perc tested and the holes not being refilled.

CLOSED SESSIONS: Closed sessions may be called by the Executive Committee Chairman to discuss sensitive or confidential matters pertaining to personnel.

SCOPE: The Executive Committee is formed to:

- a. Represent the Board of Trustees in personnel administration.
- b. Develop personnel policies.
- c. Coordinate personnel activities and policies between the various committees supervising employees.
- d. Interface between the Board of trustees and Lake Limerick membership on community matters and activities.
- e. Act on behalf of the Board of Trustees on routine operation.
- f. Act on behalf of the Board of Trustees on matters related to interpretation of policy in an emergency situation. Such action to be read in the next scheduled Board of Trustees meeting and noted in the Board minutes.

REVIEW: Executive Committee bylaws to be reviewed annually.

QUORUM: A simple majority of the committee members.

GREENHOUSES: (Approved by the Lake Limerick Board of Trustees 1/20/90)

Background and authority:

Lake Limerick Country Club inc. has declarations of restrictions that are binding on properties in each of it's five subdivisions. Because not all eventualitys could be foreseen provisions are made within these declarations for adoption "rules" by the architectural committee to regulate buildings and other development of the properties.

Intent:

To establish uniform rules to regulate construction, use, and maintenance of "greenhouses" in all divisions of Lake Limerick. To allow each homeowner maximum flexibility in the type of construction he considers an improvement to his lot while protecting the rural-residential nature of and property values within the development by minimizing the off site visual impact of greenhouses.

Rules:

- A: All other Lake Limerick rules, restrictions, and guidelines apply unless stated otherwise. Permit fees same as storage shed rates.
- B: All Mason county permits are acquired by owner.
- C; Must be appurtenant to an existing structure.
- D: Size limitations:
 - 1) Will not draw attention from the appurtenant or adjacent residences.
 - 2) 10' maximum height.
 - 3) 20' maximum wall length.
 - 4) 250 square feet maximum measured outside furthest projection (dripline, overhang, deck, etc.)
 - 5) 1,750 cubic feet maximum enclosure.

E: Materials:

- 1) All materials must be treated or otherwise decay resistant.
- 2) Covering:
 - a) Glass is preferred and such greenhouses will be considered permanent structures.
 - b) Fiberglass can be used but such structures are considered temporary and are subject to reapproval every 18 months.
 - c) Plastic film or sheeting is not allowed.

F: Landscaping and Clearing:

1) A natural landscape is desired and no clearing for increased sunlight will be allowed nearer than 5' of property lines unless application for such clearing includes a landscaping plan, with time table, to minimize any visual impact from outside the lot on which the greenhouse is constructed.

2) Where natural landscape has already been disturbed a landscaping plan, with time table, will be required to reestablish a minimum of a 5' buffer on all property lines.

G: Uses:

- 1) No commercial applications are allowed.
- 2) Not to be used as general storage space.
- 3) Not to be used as additional living space.
