PERSONNEL POLICY

PERSONNEL POLICY, effective November 26, 1977, as revised January 1, 1979, November 3, 1979, May 10, August 9, 1980, November 23, 1981, October 9, 1982, April 9, 1983, October 19, 1985, August 15, 1987, August 19, 1989, March 21, 1992 and October 9, 1993.

SECTION I.

ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEE: Non-seasonal, salaried and hourly employees who have been employed at LLCC for three consecutive months, based on a 40 hour week.

VACATION: Two weeks after one year from date of employment, three weeks after five years of employment. Benefit is prorated by month between employee's Anniversary date and the start of the next fiscal year. Vacation to be approved by the Executive Committee and Committee Chairman. Any unused vacation will not be paid. Vacation must be taken within fiscal year.

HOLIDAYS: New Year's Day, President's Day, Memorial Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. An employee working a holiday shall receive one and one half pay, providing that he/she has worked as scheduled the day before and the day after the holiday. If a holiday falls on an employee's regular day off, he/she will be compensated with a day off with pay, with agreement of his/her supervisor.

SICK LEAVE: Up to ten days each year after one continuous year of employment. Unused sick leave from previous year may be accumulated to a maximum of fifteen days. A physician's excuse may be required for any absence.

MEDICAL BENEFITS: The employee will be provided with a medical insurance plan, as determined by the Executive Committee. If the employee should already carry health insurance from a bona fide carrier and can furnish proof of such coverage, LLCC will pay into that amount equivalent to what is paid for every other employee.

PAID LEAVE: Three days paid leave will be granted for the death of an immediate family member (spouse, children, parents, and siblings), one day paid leave will be granted for other family death.

SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP: An employee, part or full time, shall be given a social membership upon request, to be used only by the employee, not to their spouse, family, etc. The membership will automatically terminate on the termination of employment.

OVERTIME: The work week will begin Thursday A.M. and continue through Wednesday P.M.; the work week be based on a forty hour work week, with overtime paid in addition to forty hours.

PERFORMANCE REVIEW: To be evaluated annually or when deemed appropriate by the appropriate committee chairman, supervisor or the Executive Committee, regardless of the anniversary date of employment.

DUTY CHANGES: To be reported quarterly. Position descriptions to be updated if required, and reviewed with the employee and the committee chairman.

MILEAGE: Any employee or committee person who is REQUIRED to use their vehicle for LLCC business will be reimbursed at .27 per mile.

SECTION II.

PART TIME EMPLOYMENT: Holiday Pay: Time and one half if employee works.

Overtime Pay: Time and one half over 40 hours per week.

SECTION III.

PROCEDURES:

Hiring: The Executive Committee, as manager, has the authority and responsibility to hire employees.

Safety: The safety program established by LLCC will be strictly adhered to by the employee. Negligence or lack of care may result in dismissal.

Discipline: Reasonable disciplinary measures may be taken by the Executive Committee or delegate, including, but not limited to; reprimand, suspension without pay, etc.

Termination: An employee may be terminated by the Executive Committee or its delegate.

SECTION IV.

ADDITIONS TO PERSONNEL POLICY:

1. In addition to past practice the Office Manager is the only employee who is entitled to comp time. Overtime must be authorized by Department Supervisors unless an emergency situation develops or exists.
2. Pay increases will only be considered after a 90 day probation if it was negotiated at the hire date:
 - a. There will be no automatic raises.
 - b. Raises will be granted on a merit system of performance and budget conditions.
 - c. The Executive Committee will approve or revise supervisors' recommendations to assure budget compliance and interdepartmental consistency.
3. Jury duty will not be paid for by Lake Limerick Country Club, Inc.
4. Company vehicles will not be used for personal business. Tools may be used by employees with supervisors permission. If qualified to use any damage of loaned tools will be employees responsibility.
5. Personal call on Lake Limerick Country Club phones by employees will be left to supervisor's discretion.
6. Checks will be given to employees only unless said employee has granted written permission to someone else to pick up check.

RE: Review Status -- Proposed Recreation Field

The Committee appointed by the Board of Trustees to evaluate the proposed recreation field offered by Rob Wilson-Hoss has concluded that the wide range of issues requiring resolution prior to a membership decision makes an October, 93 vote impractical. Therefore, it is the committee's plan to provide an informal update of issue review at the October meeting, with a formal presentation for membership decision in April 1994.

The following represents a list of issues to be resolved, and cost impact estimated, along with tentative decisions reached by committee consensus.

1. Review of conditions for inclusion in possible agreement between Lake Limerick and Wilson-Hoss
delete "wonder"
- a. ~~Property~~ fence between the recreation field and Wilson-Hoss property including appropriate warning signs
- b. Install water well, well house, power supply, & storage tank, if needed
- c. Comply with all applicable Government regulations
- d. Use restricted to Lake Limerick members recreation
- e. Property may revert to Wilson-Hoss under circumstances to be defined
- f. Lot 96 Easement required from Wilson-Hoss for transit to recreation field and for electrical power
- g. If needed, Wilson-Hoss will be asked to provide appropriate easements to the south of the property for restroom, septic system, and related facilities
- h. Proposed contract between Lake Limerick and Wilson-Hoss to include above items plus retention of well-water rights by Lake Limerick Country club in perpetuity, legal description of property (which may require survey), and the time frame for improvements

2. An update to members is planned for the October 30 meeting and will include status on above items plus:
 - a. No special assessment is currently planned - Improvements would be funded as a separate capital item from existing dues and assessments
 - b. An advisory ballot from members present to guide subsequent actions
3. Estimates for all expected Lake Limerick obligations related to acquisition of the recreation field are being developed or reviewed
4. Planned development of the recreation field during the first two years are expected to include:
 - a. Grading, water well, sprinkler system, grass, & drainage culvert
 - b. Parking lot(Lot 100 & 101), Residential screening fences, path along green belt from lot 100 to the recreation field
 - c. Portable Toilets,
 - d. Insurance coverage
 - e. Maintenance of all the above items

Lake Limerick will be supported by independent counsel in the negotiation and finalization of all formal documents pertaining to this acquisition

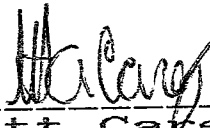

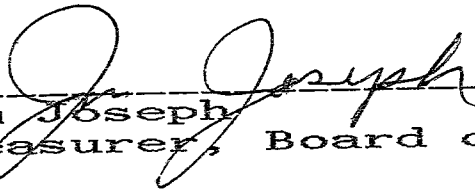
WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Lake Limerick Country Club seeks to acquire funds for the replacement of a greens mower.

DOCKS AND FLOATS---REQUIREMENTS FOR APPROVAL

REVISION AUGUST 1994

1. DEFINITION:

This regulation applies to all structures commonly known as docks, floats, wharves, etc., to be called docks herein.

2. GOALS:

The primary goals of this regulation are to prevent encroachment by docks into the lake, to prevent docks from covering up the shore line more than necessary, and to enhance to aesthetic value of each dock. No docks will be permitted at Leprechan Lake.

3. STRUCTURE, SIZE AND ATTACHMENT:

All docks are to be supported by styrofoam logs, with no railings or other vertical structure. No dock will be more than 294 square feet in total. No walkway will be more than 8 feet wide, nor less than 4 feet wide. No part of any dock will be more than 20 feet in length. Acceptable configurations will be 'L', 'T', or 'Straight'. When using 'L' or 'T' configurations, the float platform will be a maximum of 10 feet by 16 feet. All docks will be attached to the shore in a way that allows them to float in the water. Docks must be at least 10 feet from side or projected side lot lines into the lake. Treated wood may be used so long as it is dry-cured for at least 10 days and not applied fresh.

4. FLOATS:

No unattached floats will be allowed in Lake Limerick except any maintained by the Club for the common use of all members. Floats in Leprechan Lake are to be a maximum of 100 square feet, with no dimension larger than 10 feet. These floats may not be attached to the shore.

5. DISCRETION:

Docks/floats are to be a maximum of 20 feet in length. Only in those cases where shallow water exists the following will apply:

- a. A dock length of 40 feet absolute maximum or 36 inches of normal summer water depth, whichever comes first.
- b. Water depth will be measured to determine the permitted dock length projected from the normal high water shore line.
- c. Normal summer water depth will be determined 10 inches above the dam spillway by adjusting actual lake level to the "lake level gauge" (located at spillway).

6. APPLICATIONS:

All dock applications will be reviewed for compliance with the goals set forth above. Applications must be screened by the Lake/Dam Committee before action by the Architectural Committee. Dock configuration is to be drawn on the application, and forwarded to the Architectural Committee for its decision. Applications will be considered on a case by case basis.

7. EXCEPTIONS:

Dock lengths as identified in item #5 will not include docks that because of their length or location would obstruct boat traffic and recreational use.
