BOARD OF TRUSTEES November 18, 2000

ROLL CALL:

Vice-President Scott Carey called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Trustees attending the meeting are Secretary Esther Springer-Johannesen, Treasurer Bill Buff, Trustee Ruby Bailey, Trustee Tom Taylor, Trustee Mary Lou Trautmann, Trustee Don Cox, Trustee Keith Smith, and Trustee Gene Metz. Trustees excused are President Darrell Winans and Trustee Charles Hancuff.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Motion made by Tr. Bill Buff, seconded by Tr. Mary Lou Trautmann, and carried by the Board as follows:

The Board of Trustees approved the minutes of October 21, 2000 as presented.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Bill Buff

Treasurer Bill Buff noted the board had copies of the Unaudited P & L's for Fiscal Year 1999 – 2000, the Audited P & L's for Fiscal Year 1999 – 2000 and the October 2000-2001 P & L's. He reviewed the October 2000 (one month into the 2000-2001 fiscal year) Cash Flow reports with the board.

Consent Agenda Item 1. 2001 Christmas Parties, Tom & Jerry and Children's. Inn Chairperson Ruby Bailey discussed the date changed for the Tom & Jerry, and Children's Christmas from the second weekend in December to the third weekend in December 2001.

Consent Agenda Item 4. Inn Drainage

George Duffin handed out a proposal from Darrell Winans that would remove excess water from the Inn foundation caused by roof gutter and driveway runoff.

The Board of Trustees approved transferring \$2,100.00 from the Maintenance Salaries Budget to Maintenance Repair and Maintenance Budget to cover the cost of the Inn Drainage Project.

new crossing under St. Andrews Drive. The project was approved in the 2000 – 2001
Capital Budget.

The greens keeper presented a plan to work on #2 tee box, remove bunkers on #3 and on #7 with relocation at the last green's meeting. The Golf Budgets for the fiscal year will absorb these costs.

The Inn Committee had discussed a new wall in the dining area to prevent smoke from entering the dining room from the kitchen. George Duffin will address the ventilation problem with the Maintenance Department.

George Duffin has experience with various POS Systems (cash register system with tracking) and will talk to Andreas. He will bring the issue to the next board meeting. The board addressed paying for the POS system from LLCC's ED Jones Reserves account. The ED Jones Reserve account would be reimbursed the approved \$2700 for this fiscal year.

INN DRAINAGE PROPOSAL 11/18/00

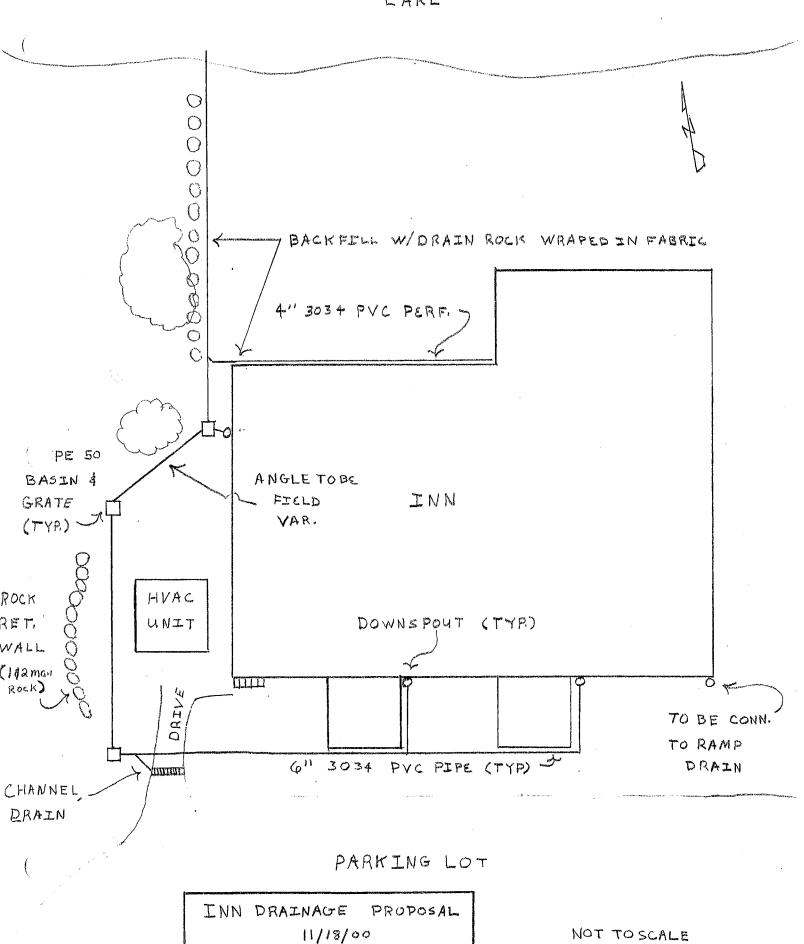
The reason for this proposal is to help eliminate the water damage being caused in the lower portion of the Inn. The situation came to light when the Inn committee was contemplating laying carpet in the entire restaurant area. The problem of lifting tiles and weeping floor was brought up. Darrell and Dave investigated to find the roof gutters on the Southwest side of the Inn are not tight lined away from the building but are dumped near the foundation. I understand that there may be a curtain drain on that side of the building to channel water away from the foundation. If there is a drain it has failed or cannot handle the flow during periods of rain which causes puddling on the surface area showing saturated soils. The roof area is extremely large and dumps large amounts of water on the foundation of the building. This will only continue to deteriorate the soils under the Inn and cause settling and more water damage. This water needs to be tight lined away from the building. In the process of laying the new line we would also install drainage along the lawn on the lake side of the Inn to help dry it out.

To fund this project I would recommend that the board would authorize transfer of funds from maintenance salaries to repair and maintenance to cover complete cost of the project.

The proposal does not include gutters large enough to handle the flow from the roof. We were unable to get anyone to come out to give us an estimate. Seems the good weather has everyone to busy to look at our job.

As a side note to this project the root structure of a fir tree on the Northwest corner of the Inn has been undermined, the digging of this line may cause additional root damage and may be necessary to remove. This tree also does no favors to the building with its limbs overhanging the roof and passage for bugs we are now spraying for.

As you know I accepted the ruling of the board some years ago on the Ayers/Blowers drain line. The precedent has now been set over ruling our prior request. We (Ayers/Blowers) have a much better reason than the Meyers/Haworth have. They had a drainage problem. We had a drainage problem also. The other reason we had was that the drain line installed by LLCC was too small in diameter and due to all the surrounding building it plugged up. Another reason is that LLCC had previously (6 to 8 years ago) come onto our property and extended this LLCC drain line at no cost to the property owners.
