### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES - LAKE LIMERICK COUNTRY CLUB**

October 16<sup>th</sup> 2004 9:00 MINUTES

### President Tom Taylor called the meeting to order at 9:05 am

### I. ROLL CALL:

President Tom Taylor, Vice President Scott Carey, Treasurer Esther Springer-Johannesen, Secretary Shirley Toner, Trustees, Dick Sirokman, Pat Feist, Mike Powter, Pat Chaussee, and Keith Smith. Don Nichols & Tony Paradise was excused. Employee Marianne Koch

### **Guest attending:**

Bill McDonald, Theresa Taylor, Chuck Hancuff, Nan Stricklin, Janice Vocke and Rosemary Wilson.

### II. GUESTS FROM THE FLOOR: Request to be added to the agenda

Nan Stricklin Openings of positions on board (3) and water committee (2). Chuck Hancuff- regarding winter permits for trailers.

### III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

A motion was made by Ester Springer-Johannesen, seconded by Scott Carey and passed as follows, with no nays:

To accept the minutes of September 2004, with the following changes Item 2 correction of Wilson hoss to Wilson.

### J. FINANCIAL REPORT: Esther Springer-Johannesen Treasurer

Ester Springer-Johannesen reviewed the year to date comparative, noting that the inn has had a 20,000 increase in sales and that the cart rental fees are up from 8,000 to 13500+.

The WGEP is still working on creating an insurance pool and will possibly have more information by Nov. We have pursued and been told that the dues, as well as water capital improvement expenses are not subject to excise tax. This could mean a refund of around \$27,000.

Don Gardner will be meeting with Sheila on Tuesday, to begin to finalize year-end books. The financials should be done shortly thereafter.

A motion was made by Pat Feist, seconded by Shirley Toner and passed as follows, with no nays: To accept the Financials of September 2004, as presented.

### V. CONSENT AGENDA: (Committees motions)

Discussion was held on the lake/dam motion, regarding devising a plan for use of environmentally safe pesticides on the golf course. It was generally agreed that it was the committee's responsibility to create and present solutions for the board to vote on. It was felt that the expertise was within individual committees, and that it would be presumptuous of the board to create any plan.

A motion was made by Dick Sirokman, seconded by Pat Feist and passed as follows, with no nays: To consent agenda with the following changes:

The Lake dam motion was deferred back to the lake/dam and greens committees to jointly create a comprehensive plan to present to the board with cost and detailed actions.

### **VI.OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1. Backhoe update- Scott Carey is waiting for the estimate on repairs and has given a deadline of Weds 3:30 pm. The bid was cut down from \$11,000 to ½. The cost estimate would be \$5,000 with a possible exception being the brakes, which may add additional cost.
- 2. Lawsuit update: Tom Taylor passed out the settlement finding and reviewed.

- 1. RCW 64.38, the Homeowners Association Act, applies to homeowners' associations such as Lake Limerick that were formed prior to 1995, the effective date of the statute, because the statue as properly interpreted expresses the intent that it so apply, and that this application does not interfere with any vested rights.
- 2. RCW64.38.025 (3) provides for approval or rejection of Board proposed assessment, expense and reserve budgets. Approval by the statutory process includes approval of the assessments needed to fund such budgets. Any contradictory provisions regarding assessments within the Lake Limerick Bylaws are superseded by this statute. The approval of an assessment budget pursuant to the statutory scheme necessarily results in the approval of the imposition of the assessments within said approved budget.
- 3. The reliance of the Lake Limerick Board on the system for imposition of assessments set out in RCW 64.38.025(3), as opposed to the contradictory provisions of the Lake Limerick Bylaws; and the refusal of the Board to enact the "amendments" at issue herein regarding member participation in employee hiring, and a twenty percent cap on "subsidies" for the golf course and inn; were lawful, because the system for the imposition of assessments in the Lake Limerick Bylaws, and the proposed amendments, are contrary to RCW 64.38.25(3), and are therefore illegal, and have no effect.

Discussion followed. The board can increase dues according to what they see as needed. The members have the right and duty to attend committee meetings and pay attention to the issues.

### VII. NEW BUSNESS:

- 1. Sprinkler system: Tom presented financing options to the board. Discussion was held on different options 4 year vs. 3 year, the finance charges would be at least an \$11,000 difference. Conversation over giving members an option of spreading the payments over 2 years which would allow the club to meet the loan payment obligations, with a percentage of delinquent members. It was agreed that the coast of repairing and maintaining the current system should be explained to the members, as well as the increasing cost of replacing the system.
- 2. Crabtree easement waiver, which would allow a member to move an easement from between lots 204 & 205 to the side of 204.

A motion was made by Dick Sirokman, seconded by Ester Springer Johannesen and passed as follows, with no nays:

To consent to the approval made by the architectural committee to grant the repositioning of lot owners Div 3/204 & 205 trail easement to one side of his lot

A letter will be written by secretary Shirley Toner for the county.

- **3.** Shirley Toner will present employee handbook, with any grammar corrections by next meeting.
- 4. By-law update on hold for lawsuit conclusion.
- **5.** Park Host; Discussion was held on whether on not to have park host or if they should be part time. This is a split issue, how ever as long as we do have park host we should have a contract per our attorney

- 2. RCW 64.38.025(3) provides for approval or rejection of Board-proposed assessment, expense and reserve budgets. Approval by the statutory process includes approval of the assessments needed to fund such budgets. Any contradictory provisions regarding assessments within the Lake Limerick Bylaws are superseded by this statute. The approval of an assessment budget pursuant to the statutory scheme necessarily results in the approval of the imposition of the assessments within said approved budget;
- 3. The reliance of the Lake Limerick Board on the system for imposition of assessments set out in RCW 64.38.025(3), as opposed to the contradictory provisions of the Lake Limerick Bylaws; and the refusal of the Board to enact the "amendments" at issue herein regarding member participation in employee hiring, and a twenty percent cap on "subsidies" for the golf course and inn; were lawful, because the system for the imposition of assessments in the Lake Limerick Bylaws, and the proposed amendments, are contrary to RCW 64.38.025(3), and are therefore illegal, and have no effect.
- 4. Summary Judgment is ordered in favor of Defendant Lake Limerick on all matters at issue in its Summary Judgment Motion. Matters at issue regarding further award of costs and attorney fees will be heard by this Court upon proper motion and note of the same.
