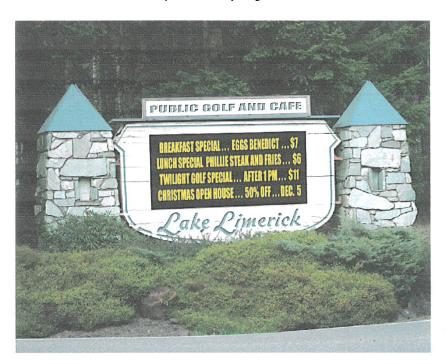

Update 1/15/09

Proposal: Computer animated, LED Readerboard sign on Mason Lake Rd.

The following information is an update of the "Readerboard" sign project as well as a summary of the project.



Benefits:

Sales Increase – SBA study shows a 15% increase One time advertising cost with a lifetime return on investment Enhance awareness of Lake Limerick community activities Opportunity to sell advertising space – New source of income

Financial Justification:

Anticipate a 5% – 15% increase in sales Annual sales \$567,000 could increase \$28,350 - \$85,050 Cost could be split between 4 budgets Advertising space could be offered at \$200 per month

Cost:

\$27,000 – Includes permits, software, training, warranty and installation

Possible concerns:

Danger of being too visibly "loud" for the area.
