

Animals in the LLCC

Inn and Pro Shop

Only service dogs, service dogs in training, or animals used for LLCC programs are allowed inside the LLCC Inn and Pro Shop. Owners of pets will be asked to remove them from the buildings. Animals or pets of any kind that are not allowed inside the buildings also may not be secured or abandoned anywhere on LLCC community grounds.

- ☐ Only dogs are recognized as a “service animal” under Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Service dogs are trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities.
- ☐ Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the ADA.
- ☐ Service dogs must be under the control of a handler and have a harness, leash, or other tether at all times, unless the handler is unable to leash or harness the dog because of a disability or it would interfere with the service dog’s safe, effective performance of work or tasks.
- ☐ LLCC staff may ask an individual to remove a service dog from the premises if the dog is out of control or if the dog is not housebroken.
- ☐ No unattended animals are allowed on LLCC community property.

According to the Washington State Human Rights Commission and ADA, LLCC staff may ask an individual who brings a dog into the LLCC Inn or Pro Shop two questions in the following order:

- ☐ Is your dog a service animal because of a disability?
- ☐ What work or task is your dog trained to perform?

Exceptions for miniature horses exist under ADA rules. Certain conditions apply. Under RCW 49.60.218, other species of animals, whether wild or domestic, trained or untrained, are not service animals.
