President's Message

With St. Patrick's Day just around the corner, Lake Limerick's elections for the Board of Directors and Water Committee vacancies are only a month away. This year two of our Board members, Norm Bartoo and Dave Kohler, have decided to take a break and are not running for re-election. Norm is wrapping up his second stint on the Board—thanks Norm. Dave has served a number of terms on the Board and as a committee chair since becoming a member and continues to serve as Chair of the Lakes/Dams/Parks (AKA Lake/Dam) Committee, in which capacity we look forward to his continuing contributions to the Association. Incumbent Connie Wong, who serves as the Association's Treasurer, has decided to run for another term. Now it's your turn as members to study the candidates and vote. Thank you to Kayla Paradise for chairing this year's Nominating Committee.



As mentioned in Connie's article on page two of the newsletter, our financial status continues to provide stable support for on-going operations and routine asset management and repair. Lake Limerick owns and operates a water system, 2 lakes, 3 dams, 7 parks, an Inn (restaurant, lounge, administrative offices and great hall), a golf course and café, and appurtenant structures and facilities. Connie is also leading LLCC's first ever Reserve Study which will identify longer term major asset maintenance, repair and replacement projects, and the financial resources that will be necessary to pay for them when needed. This study was included in this year's budget, and Connie has assembled a volunteer team representing the standing committees, staff and the community at large. This is a critically important effort for the future well-being of the community and I thank everyone involved.

Lastly, while I really don't spend time on social media, I monitor some sites like Next Door and occasionally posts regarding LLCC that may show up on other sites like Facebook. I do so because some posts relate to legitimate problems that may be happening in the community, and the ideas some of our members have for solving those problems. However, I also believe that if you really want to make a difference in the community, you have to be willing to do more than exercise your thumbs. We need members to show up at Board meetings (the 3rd Saturday every month, 9:00AM at the Inn) to express their concerns, offer constructive suggestions for improvement, and volunteer to help the Association continue to make life better at Lake Limerick. This community has a long history of volunteerism and member involvement, but as I look around at the current crop of volunteers and electeds, I see a lot of gray hair—more boomers than Gen Xers or millennials or Gen Zers. Folks, boomers are definitely ready to pass the torch. We need more members to contribute a little time on a regular basis working on our committees. Everybody has always had the conflicts for time between jobs, family and community service, but somehow enough people in the past figured out how to balance those competing needs. The work you do for the community benefits you and your families and can be a very satisfying and constructive way of spending your time.

Treasurer's Report

Happy March to everyone! The last quarter has again been a positive one, in regard to the financial situation of the HOA, across all of the service areas. Your support of the restaurant, lounge, café and golf, is the driving force and it is showing and appreciated. As treasurer, I feel the security of our funds is central to my duties to the HOA and to that end the water committee treasurer and I have worked together to successfully bring our combined Heritage Bank balances to within the insurance limits of FDIC. The reserve study steering committee kicked into gear in February. We are working to wrap our arms around the state's requirements for reserve studies, how such a study is performed, what is included in the study, what information will be required from Lake Limerick, and at what cost. We hope to have potential consulting firms narrowed down by the semi-annual meeting in April and should have more to update you with at that time. We have a budget item for this study in the current fiscal year.

The HOA is continuing monthly deposits of \$5 from everyone's monthly dues to reserve accounts at Edward Jones, specifically to cover costs for this year's capital budget, as well as to cover unexpected and future costs related to HOA asset repair and maintenance. The water committee continues to make their transfers to their specific and separate reserves accounts as well, each month.

I plan to get our investment policy finished up soon, and then will move on refining other policies and procedures relating to business and financial practices of the HOA. Once again, I am happy to serve as the HOA treasurer and thank you for the opportunity and support.

We are a diverse HOA community with a sense of pride choosing to live at Lake Limerick. We have drafted a Rights and Responsibilities document with principles Homeowners and Community Leaders can all rally around. This draft supports our HOA governance documents we all agreed to with property ownership. In an effort to continue our ongoing Community Development, we are interested in your feedback.

Rights and Responsibilities for Lake Limerick HOA Principles for Homeowners and Community Leaders

Homeowners Have the Right To:

- A responsive and competent community association.
- Honest, fair and respectful treatment by community leaders and employees.
- Participate in governing the community association by attending meetings, serving on committees and standing for election.
- Access appropriate association records.
- Prudent expenditure of fees and assessments.
- Live in a community where the association property is maintained.
- Receive all documents that address rules and regulations governing the community association—if not prior to purchase and settlement by a real estate agent or attorney, then upon joining the community.
- Fair treatment regarding financial and other association obligations, including the opportunity to discuss payment plans and options with the association before foreclosure is initiated.
- A Hearing Appeal for those decisions affecting financial responsibilities.

Homeowners Have the Responsibility To:

- Read and comply with the governing documents of the community.
- Maintain their property according to established standards.
- Treat association member residents, guests, board and committee members, community association manager, staff employees, business partners, and contractors honestly and with respect.
- Vote in community elections.
- Pay association assessments and charges on time.
- Contact Office Administration, if necessary, to discuss financial obligations and alternative payment arrangements.
- Request reconsideration of material decisions that personally affect them.
- Provide current contact information to Office Administration to help ensure they receive information from the community.
- Ensure that those who reside on their property (e.g., tenants, relatives, friends) adhere to all rules and regulations.



Community Leaders Have the Right To:

- Expect residents to know and comply with the rules and regulations of the community and to stay informed by reading materials provided by the association.
- Expect owners to meet their financial obligations to the community.
- Respectful and honest treatment from residents.
- Conduct meetings in a positive and constructive atmosphere.
- Receive support and constructive input from owners.
- Personal privacy at home and during leisure time in the community.
- Take advantage of educational opportunities (e.g., publications, training workshops) that are directly related to their responsibilities.

Community Leaders Have the Responsibility To:

- Fulfill their fiduciary duties to the community and exercise discretion in a manner they reasonably believe to be in the best interests of the community.
- Exercise sound business judgment and follow established management practices.
- Balance the needs and obligations of the community as a whole with those of individual homeowners and residents.
- Understand the association's governing documents and become educated with respect to applicable state and local laws, and to manage the community association accordingly.
- Establish committees and use other methods to obtain input from owners.
- Conduct open, fair and well-publicized elections.
- Welcome and educate new owner members to the community.
- Encourage input from members on issues affecting them personally and the community as a whole.
- Encourage events that foster neighborliness and a sense of community.
- Conduct business in a transparent manner when feasible and appropriate.
- Allow homeowners access to appropriate community records.
- Collect all monies due from owners.
- Devise appropriate and reasonable arrangements, when needed and as feasible, to facilitate the ability of individual homeowners to meet their financial obligations to the community.
- Provide a Hearings process that members can use to appeal decisions affecting their financial responsibilities or property rights.
- Initiate foreclosure proceedings as required when other methods to foster member compliance with accepted conditions, restrictions, covenants, rules, guidelines, procedures, policies, and behaviors have not worked.
- Make bylaws, policies, rules and procedures as understandable as possible.
- Provide complete and timely disclosure of personal and financial conflicts of interest related to the actions of community leaders, e.g., officers, the board and committees.

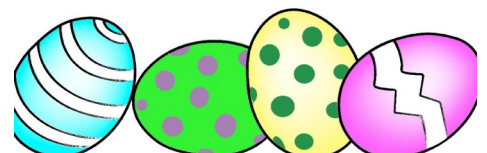

HOW TO HAVE FUN AND BE SAFE ON THE LAKE

READ THE LAKE RESTRICTION SHEET - THEN MAKE GOOD CHOICES BY FOLLOWING THEM!

The key to safety on a small and busy lake is to be able to predict what other people are going to do. Predictability happens when there is a plan that we all follow. We call our plan "Lake Restrictions." Some of it was covered in your boating course to get your boaters license, and some of it is to protect the shoreline (your parks included), non-boaters in the water, and each other. Please **READ** those restrictions so you know what to do and you'll have some idea as to what other people will do when we are all playing on the water. Let's all be predictable!

PLEASE READ THE LAKE RESTRICTIONS AGAIN TO REFRESH YOUR MEMORIES.

LAKE LIMERICK COUNTRY CLUB, Inc. LAKE RULES AND SAFETY GUIDELINES

---- LAKE RULES ----

- 1) Violation of any Federal, Washington State, Mason County or LLCC Lake Rule may result in the suspension of member's boating privileges and/or the assessment of a fine.
- 2) Members shall be responsible for their guests conduct.
- 3) Non-member power vessels (including relatives and guests) ARE NOT PERMITTED on the lake unless actively engaged in fishing.
- 4) Launching or recovery of a trailered boat from a member's property is prohibited.
- 5) No parking of motor vehicles is allowed within 20 feet of the shoreline.
- 6) All members' vessels, which require Washington State Registration, must be registered with the State, and also be registered with LLCC.
 - a. On INITIAL application for the LLCC watercraft tag, the original Washington State Registration must be presented.
 - b. The LLCC watercraft tag shall be clearly visible, either on the port or starboard side. If it cannot be seen there, then displayed on the windshield.
 - c. All vessels with Washington State Registration and NO division/lot numbers or LLCC watercraft tag WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE LAKE, unless actively fishing from that boat.
- 7) All member registered vessels shall be identified with their division and lot numbers.
 - a. The numbers are to be 3 inches high and of a CONTRASTING COLOR to the hull.
 - b. The numbers are to be displayed on the hull (towards the stern), on the port and starboard sides. If they cannot be seen there, then they are to be displayed on the port and starboard sides of the windshield.
- 8) No motorized vessel over 19 feet in length is allowed on the lake. Vessel length will be as stated on the State of Washington Vessel Certificate of Title and/or Vessel Registration. Vessel length, if disputed, will be established by physical measurement, by an authorized Lake/Dam committee member, consistent with Washington State Law, WAC 308-93-285 - Vessel Length Measurement.
 - a. Exception:
 1. Pontoon boats up to 20 feet in length are allowed.
 2. Members may request an exception from the Board, for a competition ski boat up to 20 feet in length provided certain criteria are met (ex: amid ship engine, flat bottom, no weight enhancing devices and limited wake). Requests must be submitted to the Lake/Dam Committee.
- 9) Use of personal watercraft (i.e. jet skis, and remote controlled towing devices, etc.) is prohibited.
- 10) Maximum vessel speeds on the lake shall be as follows:

a. Lakeside of the buoy line (except as noted below)	8 MPH
b. Lakeside of the buoy line during skiing hours (10:00 AM-7:00 PM daily)	35 MPH
c. Shore side of the buoy line	NO WAKE
d. Bird Sanctuary, King's Cove (Log Toy Cove)	NO WAKE
- 11) Stunting, burning donuts (making circles) and swerving (making S's), etc. are prohibited.
- 12) Vessels and skiers, exceeding 8 mph, shall remain lakeside of the buoy line at all times and 100 feet from other vessels, skiers and swimmers.

LAKE LIMERICK COUNTRY CLUB, Inc. LAKE RULES AND SAFETY GUIDELINES

- 13) Tow vessels shall have a responsible driver and responsible observer/flagger. Individual property owners shall be, at all times, responsible for verifying the qualifications of the observer/flagger and driver in their boat, according to Mason County Ordinance.
 - a. An observer/flagger shall be at least 12 years of age.
 - b. A red warning flag shall be used to denote a person in the water.
 - c. Vessels must be operated in a counter-clockwise pattern.
 - d. Skiers wishing to "drop a ski" must do so at the buoy line. Dropping a ski in the ski lanes is strictly forbidden.
 - e. When a vessel is pulling more than one person, and one falls, the other person(s) is/are required to drop off immediately. Under no circumstances shall a vessel continue down the lake, leaving a person(s) in the water.
 - f. Vessels pulling a skier shall not go inside of the buoy line (shore side) at any time. This includes starting or dropping off skiers.
- 14) Ski tournament practices are held the two weeks prior to a ski tournament (weather permitting) as follows:
 - a. Friday 7 pm to dusk
 - b. Saturday 8 am to 10 am and 7 pm to dusk
 - c. Sunday 8 am to 10 am and 7 pm to dusk

---- SAFETY GUIDELINES ----

- 15) Wind surfers and paddle boarders and all persons being towed shall wear an adequate approved flotation device.
- 16) Operation-Right-Of-Way Rules states that a swimmer has the right of way over any craft "AT ALL TIMES".
 - a. Any swimmer more than 100 feet from the shore or lakeside of the buoy line MUST be escorted by a vessel displaying a red flag.
 - b. Swimming or floating on an inner tube, mattress or other flotation device SHALL NOT be allowed lakeside of the buoy line during skiing hours.
- 17) Buoys are NOT to be used by swimmers as flotation or mooring devices.
- 18) Overnight parking of cars, vessels and campers SHALL NOT be allowed at any community access area, unless specifically authorized by the Board.
- 19) Skiing means any person(s) on water skis, a wake board or a kneeboard being pulled by a vessel.
- 20) Tubing means any person(s) on a flotation device being pulled by a vessel.
- 21) For personal safety, riding on a vessel deck, side, or standing while the vessel is under power, at speeds of 8 MPH, or greater is prohibited.
- 22) All boaters are responsible for their own wake.
- 23) All boats shall use legal navigation lights after sunset.

PARK HOSTS



Our park facilities open on April 25, 2020. Did you know that Lake Limerick Country Club has a Park Host program for four of the Club's lakeside parks? The park host program was initiated 15 years ago and has become a valuable tool to significantly reduce vandalism and in-appropriate behavior, and generally ensures the parks are available for our members and their guests to enjoy. Our volunteer hosts are typically on duty in the afternoons, until dusk on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Holidays from mid-May until mid-September. Although we have not been able to staff all built-out locations each year, we are pleased to announce that Anglia Beach, Banbury Beach, Log Toy Park and Way to Tipperary Beach will all have park hosts assigned this coming season. The hosts are asked to interact with members and their

guests to confirm membership and guest ID cards. This is for your benefit, so please be prepared to engage with the hosts in a positive manner. If you have family or guests that might use the parks without a member being present, be sure to obtain a Park Guest Pass for your family and guests. The passes are good seasonally and must be requested annually in the office. Note that the parks are open over the summer until dusk and that there is no alcohol or drugs allowed and that pets must be on a leash. Be sure to say hello and extend a warm welcome to this year's hosts Matt Jensen, Pat Paradise, David Murphy, and Bill and Carroll Adams.

LAKES WEED TREATMENT

We've scheduled weed treatments with the weed treatment company, including contingency plans, for this coming summer. We'll also be trying a different chemical formula to treat the weeds, as last summers treatment fell short of expectations.

WEED TREATMENTS – PART OF THE SOLUTION, PART OF THE PROBLEM

The GOOD - We kill weeds to help maintain the weed/algae balance, to counter the effects of failing septic systems, an oversized geese population and yard fertilizing in order to maintain fish habitats and to keep the lake looking pristine so we can all enjoy boating, swimming, fishing and wildlife watching.

The BAD - Dying weeds create nutrient rich sediment. It adds to the muck at the bottom of the lake, making the lake shallower. The shallower the lake is, the more area receives light enabling more weeds to grow.

The UGLY - Our very shallow man-made lakes were built by installing dams, and at the time, no one worried about "flushing rates (the rate water moves through the system – the slower it is, the more likely particles in the water will settle versus continuing down-stream; ours is really slow), shifting of weather patterns, culvert failures, acid rain or weed/growth rates creating nutrient rich muck." As the majority of our lakes are 12ft deep or less, it really doesn't take all that much to fill them up.

The VERY UGLY - So, between weeds dying off and creating muck, dirt falling from the sky, silt coming from the upper Cranberry Lake and the Beaver ponds north of Kings Cove amongst other events OUR LAKES ARE FILLING IN. We're going to have to UP the lake maintenance game by working to reduce the in-flow of silt and weed producing nutrients and increasing the lakes depths by removing sediment build up. The Lake Dam Committee has been provided with guidance as to what we can do in terms of prevention and mitigation. We've also been informed of the consequence of doing nothing. Each of the projects come with hefty price tags. If we choose to do nothing, we'll be looking at the VERY VERY UGLY in as little as 10 years.



WEIR BOARDS

LLCC staff will begin placing weir boards into the Lake Limerick and Lake Leprechaun dam structures beginning April 1. The weir boards provide higher lake levels in the summer and help maintain flow in the Cranberry Creek watershed. You should notice water levels rising throughout April, especially in Lake Leprechaun before the fishing derby fish are planted. Yes, Lake Leprechaun DOES get fish planted in its lake too.

DOCK NUMBERING

Numbering your docks is mandatory. Steve Glenn, a member of the Lake Dam Committee is making dock placards with reflective lettering. They are 4" x 10" aluminum plates that your division and lot number are placed on, which you can then attach to your dock with screws. The cost to you will be \$10 and the plates with numbers attached can be ordered in the office or using the application form on the LLCC website

STYROFOAM SUPPORTED DOCKS



To comply with state regulations, sometime around 2003, Lake Limerick Country Club enacted rules prohibiting the use of Styrofoam or a Styrofoam type product, whether wrapped or unwrapped, to support your dock. In August 2018 and October 2018 and February 2020 infraction letters were mailed to owners of docks still using Styrofoam floats or Styrofoam floats wrapped in plastic. You also received such a letter if your dock's condition had deteriorated to the point of no longer meeting the condition requirements for docks. Having a dock is a privilege and can be revoked if you choose not to comply with the rules that allow you that privilege in the first place. Many of the recipients of the letters have responded to the committee with plans for their dock to be in compliance or removed from the lake by the

summer of 2020. The Lake Dam Committee is deeply grateful for your response and plans for action. Thank you. For those of you who've not responded to the infraction letter, please do so immediately. If you have any questions, please contact the Lake Dam Committee or come to one of our fascinating meetings.

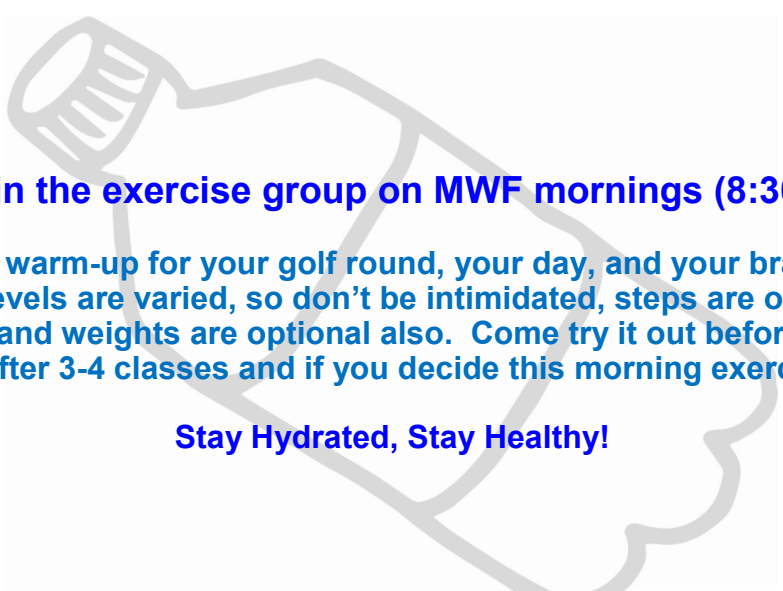

Water System Manager: As you may have heard, Joe Castelluccio has resigned as Lake Limerick Water System's (LLWS) Water System Manager. His last day was February 14. If you see him around, thank him for his 8 years of service in the Maintenance and Water departments. In his 2 years as manager of the Water department Joe has made many improvements and suggestions for further improvements to operations. We are actively advertising to fill the Water System Manager position in print and online media.

NWS Supporting LLWS: In the interim while we fill the Water Manager position, Northwest Water Systems (NWS) is providing coverage for our water system. Typically, Sean Burns, NWS, is on site filling that role. You may see him driving around checking on the system in one of the LLWS trucks or a white NWS truck. If you see him, say "Hi" and thank him for taking care of our water system. Sean has taken care of this month's meter readings and is preparing for new meters at several lots where new houses are being built.

Billing issues: The billing problems at the beginning of February were not caused by the office staff but by the postal service. Please have patience with the staff as they investigate the issue. If you don't get a bill for water or dues, you may pay anyway at the normal rates of \$30/month and \$85/month. Fortunately, at this time of year water use doesn't go above 10,000 gallons so the normal rate would apply. You can also sign up for the Payment Services Network and it will automatically take into account the actual water bill each month and send you an e-mail to confirm the payment.

High water loss: Losses for January were only a quarter of the losses in November but slightly higher than December's losses. However, there was a leak on St. Andrews in the 2400 block that has been repaired so February losses were reduced by half from January.

New meter reading system: Many new houses are being installed in the area requiring new water meters to be installed. The model of water meter we have previously used is no longer available. The new water meters require new meter reading software and hardware that supports both the old and new water meters. The new software and hardware have been purchased and are being integrated with our billing software. Training for the new system is scheduled for March 10.

Projects: Projects being completed and worked on are the following:

Underground power feed for the generator at Well #3 has been completed by RAM Electric.

At Well #3 and Well #6 Legacy Power is repairing some minor generator issues that they found during their annual inspections.

Pave-X will be filling potholes in the roads on Dartmoor Dr. and Errigal Pl. at the same time as other asphalt repairs in other areas.

Mason Lake Rd. Railroad Trestle Seismic Retrofit: The Navy has contracted to perform a seismic retrofit on the railroad trestle over Mason Lake Rd. between Olde Lyme Rd. and Clonakilty Dr. As part of the work, the 8" water main beside Mason Lake Rd. under the railroad trestle will have to be relocated. Fortunately, because Lake Limerick Water System was built in a loop configuration, the portion of the 8" water main affected by the construction can be isolated and shut off by valves at Clonakilty Dr. and at Olde Lyme Rd. and all customers will still have full water service. At this point we don't have any update on the schedule for that work.

Spring is coming, and the weather is finally starting to turn! This means --- more projects around the home. If you're planning on doing home improvements, remember the Lake Limerick Architecture Committee is here to ensure you are compliant with the bylaws of our community. Our primary purpose is to review and recommend to the Board approvals of applications for projects including, but not limited to, construction of residences, sheds, docks, fences and so on. Please keep in mind, an architectural permit is required if repair or replacement exceeds more than one half of an existing structure. As a general note when submitting applications, provide as much detail as possible about your project including plot plans with distances from the side, back and front, setbacks, materials, colors, county permits, etc.



A particular hot button over the last couple years has been docks, and the required placement of Styrofoam floats. The Lake and Dam Committee recently sent a letter regarding this and other dock issues. Please make sure that you submit a permit application for the work that you are planning on doing. These applications will go to your L/D Committee first, then to us for approval and permits.

We meet on the second Saturday of every month at 9AM at the Inn. Our goal in reviewing and providing feedback is within a week of the committee receiving your application. For the more difficult or complicated ones, we review them together during our meeting. Everyone is free to attend, especially if you have submitted a permit and need the feedback quickly.

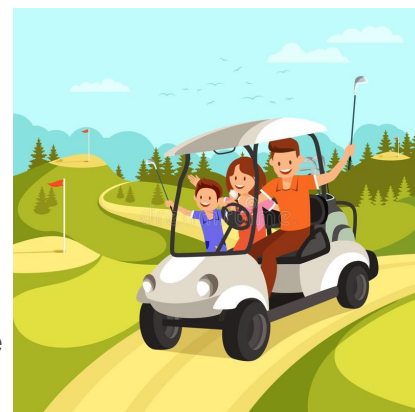
