Lake Limerick & Lake Leprechaun Water Quality Update

Dear Lake Limerick Community Members,

The Lake/Dam Committee would like to provide an important update regarding current water conditions in Lake Limerick and Lake Leprechaun.

Recently, we have observed changes in water conditions in Lake Leprechaun, including what appears to be a biofilm bloom. Similar conditions are now also being observed on Lake Limerick. Because of these observations, we have taken steps to have the water tested and to seek professional guidance regarding the health and safety of our lakes.

Health Department Recommendation

Water samples have been tested by the Health Department. Based on the information currently available, the Health Department is advising that swimming and other activities involving direct contact with lake water be restricted at this time.

The Health Department is also advising that animals and pets should not be allowed to drink water from the lakes.

Until we receive additional information, we are asking community members to follow these recommendations for both Lake Limerick and Lake Leprechaun.

- **Restrict swimming and direct contact with lake water.**
- **Do not allow pets or other animals to drink from the lakes.**
- **Use additional caution around areas where unusual water conditions, surface material, discoloration, or accumulations are visible.**

What We Are Doing

The Lake/Dam Committee is continuing to investigate these conditions and is working to better understand what is occurring in our lake system.

Additional water quality and lake health testing will help us evaluate current conditions and determine what factors may be contributing to what we are seeing. We are also seeking guidance from lake management professionals regarding appropriate next steps and whether additional testing, monitoring, or management actions are recommended.

At this time, we do not want to speculate about the exact cause or extent of the conditions until we have sufficient testing results and professional guidance.

Our priority is the health and safety of our community and the long-term health of Lake Limerick and Lake Leprechaun. We believe it is important to be proactive and transparent with the community as we work through this situation.
